PERSONAL PAPERS

Blackburn, Benjamin. 1 leaf and 2 pages.

Land grant, 1 September 1753, for 181 acres located in Frederick County, Virginia, to Benjamin Blackburn of Frederick County from Thomas, Lord Fairfax (1693-1781), proprietor of the Northern Neck. Gift of Brian D. and Nonna D. Good, Maurertown. (52399)

Hunton, Eppa. 2 pages.

Report, 11 June 1861, from Colonel Eppa Hunton (1822-1908), of the 8th Virginia Infantry at Camp Mason in Loudoun County, Virginia, to Lieutenant Colonel Thomas Jordan (1819-1895), adjutant to General P. G. T. Beauregard (1818-1893). Hunton notes a report of Union troops, including artillery, across the Potomac River that appear to heading in his direction. Hunton plans to take up the railroad tracks in his area with a force of slaves. Purchased. (52334)

Hussey, John. 31 leaves, photocopies.

Transcript of the diary of John Hussey (1816-1879) of Lewis County, (West) Virginia, detailing his work involving railroads, his social life, and his courtship of and marriage to Maria Brennan. He describes the weather and social life. Gift of Katherine Hussey Frederickson, Ridgeland, Mississippi. (52253)

Jewel, Altus H. 4 pages.

Letter, 27 March 1863, from Altus H. Jewel, Company E, 77th New York Infantry, in Stafford County, Virginia, to his brother and sister in Saratoga County, New York, writing about camp life in the army and soldiers' attitudes. He also comments on family and friends. Purchased. (52330)

Jewel, Altus H. 4 pages.

Letter, 28 July 1863, from Altus H. Jewel, Company E, 77th New York Infantry in Fauquier County, Virginia, to his sister in Saratoga County, New York, writing about an African American woman who cooks and washes clothes for Jewel and other soldiers and who tells them the prices of foodstuffs in Virginia. Jewel also comments about drawing new clothing, the rain, and the Rappahannock River. He comments that he doesn't swear, gamble, or steal. Purchased. (52331)

Koonce, Bettie E. 5 leaves and 19 pages.

Diary, 5-20 September 1862, kept by Bettie E. Koonce (1837-1920) of Harper's Ferry, Jefferson County, (West) Virginia, detailing the events surrounding the capture of Harper's Ferry by Confederate forces under the command of Stonewall Jackson (1824-1863). She writes about the Union troops stationed in Harper's Ferry, and the town's bombardment and surrender to Jackson's troops. She also comments on family and social news. Purchased. (52354)

Lohrenz, Otto. 119 leaves.

Research, titled "A New Class of Parsons: The Revolutionary Generation of Virginia's Anglican Ministers," by Otto Lohrenz, Professor of History (emeritus) at the University of Nebraska, Kearney. Research supplies in-depth data regarding the ministers who served Anglican parishes in Virginia during the years of the American Revolution and provides information on their birth, education, military and public service, property owned, biographical information, and information on the ministers' wives and children. Gift of Otto Lohrenz, Omaha, Nebraska. (52011)

Maury, William Lewis. 1 leaf.

Letter of recommendation, 1 December 1871, for William Lewis Maury (1813-1878) from E. & S. Wortham and Company, Richmond, Virginia, to Albert Ordway (1843-1897) of Richmond, recommending Maury as a replacement for the recently deceased Robert Dabney Minor (1827-1871) as chief engineer for the James River Improvement. Letter mentions an enclosed recommendation (not found) by Matthew Fontaine Maury (1806-1873). Purchased. (52351)

Rhea, William F. 13 leaves and 2 pages.

Letters, 1900, 1902, to William F. Rhea, Congressman for the 9th Congressional District covering Southwest Virginia, from constituents requesting help in acquiring fish to stock local streams and lakes in the district. Also includes letters from George M. Bowers, Commissioner of Fish and Fisheries informing Rhea that fish have been deposited to fulfill requests. Purchased. (52088)

Rinker Family. 5 leaves and 2 pages.

Papers, 1850-1863, of the Rinker family of Shenandoah County, Virginia, consisting of two certificates to Levi Rinker (1809-1888) for donations to the Washington National Monument Society; letter, 11 April 1862, from Rebecca Lantz (1826-1910) of Shenandoah County to her husband Samuel M. Lantz (1820-1885), Company C, 7th Virginia, Cavalry, regarding Union troops near their home in Shenandoah County; letter, 25 December 1862, from R. E. Hammon (1840-1876) of Company K, 12th Virginia Cavalry, to Ella (Virginia Ellen) Rinker (1844-1927) of Shenandoah County stating he hopes to be able to see her soon; and letter, 16 September 1863, from Hammon, in Madison County, Virginia, to Ella Rinker concerning camp life and fighting between Confederate and Union troops. Rives, William C. 1 leaf.

Letter, 13 May 1844, from William C. Rives, Washington D.C., to William Barton Rogers (1804-1882), asking Rogers to deliver a box to the post office in Albemarle County, Virginia, for Judith Rives (1802-1882) on Rogers' return trip to the University of Virginia from Washington. Purchased. (52350)

Ryland, Charlotte Lindsay Tritton. 1 volume.

Diary, 1943, of Charlotte Lindsay Tritton Ryland (1879-1960) of Richmond, Virginia, describing life in Richmond during World War II. Ryland comments on her family, including her sons, daughters-in-law, and grandchildren, as well as her future husband Herman Devenney (1875-1949). She discusses social life in Richmond and how life is affected by the war. Gift of C. Lindsay Ryland, Mechanicsville. (52389)

Seay, Junius Hardin. 4 pages.

Letters, 10 and 28 July 1861, from Junius Seay (1818-1903) of the 14th Virginia Infantry at Jamestown Island, to his niece Rebecca Seay (1843-1868) of Amelia County, Virginia. 10 July letter comments on the heat and mosquitoes at Camp Allen on Jamestown Island and Seay's hope that he will be visiting soon. 28 July letter comments on a move from Camp Allen to nearby Camp Hodges, where the food (fish and meat) and air are better. Seay states he turned down a promotion and comments on troops from Amelia and Nottoway Counties participating in recent battles. Purchased. (52348)

Sheffey, Hugh W. 15 pages.

Letters, 1844-1854, of Hugh W. Sheffey (1815-1889) of Staunton, Virginia, containing letters to Sheffey regarding legal cases and affairs in Staunton; efforts to macadamize the Scottsville and Staunton Road; the possible route of the Virginia Central Railroad west out of Staunton to Bath County, Virginia; and payment for student at Sheffey's school for girls. Also a letter, 14 January 1844, from Charles C. Gibson in North Carolina, to James K. Gibson, of Washington County, Virginia, regarding Charles' travel in North Carolina and his injuries in a wagon accident. Purchased. (52203)

Wimer, Abram. 2 leaves.

Land grant, 30 December 1842, for 160 acres in Hardy County, (West) Virginia, to Abram Wimer (b. ca. 1795). Grant is signed by Lieutenant Governor John M. Gregory (1804-1884), acting as governor. Gift of Billy S. and Mesa Allsbrook, Hallieford. (52035)

Wise, Henry A. 6 leaves and 26 pages.

Papers, 1833-1840, of Henry A. Wise (1806-1876) of Accomack County, Virginia, and United States Congressman, concerning his duel with political opponent Richard Coke (1790-1851) of Gloucester County, Virginia; his involvement in the duel between Congressmen William J. Graves (1805-1848) of Kentucky and Jonathan Cilley (1802-1838) of Maine; and his role in preventing a duel between Mr. Segar and Mr. Savage. Collection includes correspondence, broadsides, and newspaper articles. Purchased. (52081)

Wolf, Jacob. 1 leaf and 2 pages.

Land grant, 26 August 1789, for 107 acres located in Frederick County, Virginia, to Jacob Wolf of Frederick County from Beverley Randolph (1754-1797), Governor of Virginia. Gift of Brian D. and Nonna D. Good, Maurertown. (52399)

Wynne Family. 4 pages.

Papers, 1865, of the Wynne family of James City County and Danville, Virginia, consisting of a petition, 29 May 1865, from Thomas G. Wynne (1834-1904) to Brigadier General B. C. Ludlow, commanding the Peninsula District; and a petition, 12 August 1865, from R. C. Wynne (1804-1866) to Colonel Brown of the Bureau of Refugees, Freeman, and Abandoned Lands. Both petitions request the return of their property in James City County, which had been rented out by the army and the Bureau to former slaves. Purchased. (52347)
