Bridgforth Family. 11 leaves.

Lunenburg County, Virginia, 1805–1947. Bible of William Louis Bridgforth, Jr. (1843–1893) and Frances A. Tisdale Bridgforth (1844–1909). Bible printed in 1888. Other surnames mentioned include: Collier, Crenshaw, Harris, Maddux, Ragsdale, Robertson, Shackelton, Tisdale, and Williams. Gift of Ed Miller, Richmond. (45595)

Claybrook Family. 5 leaves.

Amelia and Brunswick Counties, Virginia, 1769–1872. Bible printed in 1839. Bible of Chastain Claybrook (1787–1846) and Catharine Malone Claybrook (1817–1849). Other surnames mentioned: Cook, Malone, Nash, Taylor, and Walker. Gift of James B. Cook, III, Chester. (50073)

Corbin Family. 6 leaves.

Pittsylvania County, Virginia, 1788–1879. Notebook (labeled “A Book of ages”) kept by Jameson Corbin (1788–1879). Includes Corbin family dates, as well as multiple records of slave births and deaths. Entries record each slave’s first name, mother’s first name, and date of birth or death. Loaned for duplication by Ellen A. Hill, Virginia Beach. (50144)

Creegan Family. 9 leaves.

Alexandria, Virginia, 1856–1948. Bible of John Creegan (d. 1896). Bible printed in 1882. Includes Bible records (7 leaves) and two unidentified photographic portraits (2 leaves). Other surnames mentioned: Burke, Edelin, Edmonds, Kinslow, McCann, Purvis, Reinhardt, Simpson, Tatsapaugh, Thomas, and Williams. Loaned for duplication by Sommer Wickham, Chesterfield. (50146)

Denton Family. 9 leaves.

Henrico and Louisa Counties, and Richmond, Virginia, 1791–1867. Bible of Allen Denton (1793–1857). Bible printed in 1818. Most of the dates recorded are those of slave births, listing the first (and sometimes middle) names of the mother and child, along with the year of birth. Other surnames mentioned: Alvis, Bodie, and Toler. Loaned for duplication by Macon Sizemore, Richmond. (50015)

Hundley Family. 7 leaves.

Essex and Middlesex Counties, Virginia, 1757–1942. Bible of Larkin Hundley (1795–1872). Other surnames mentioned: Dyke, Evans, and Whiting. Transferred from Hundley Family Papers, Accession 50051. (50053)

Avery, Daisy Lester. 9 cubic feet.

Papers, 1906–1982, of Daisy Lester Avery (1889–1983) of Richmond, Virginia, including correspondence and subject files, mainly relating to her involvement with the United Confederate Veterans and the United Daughters of the Confederacy. The collection also contains letters of her son, James Thomas Avery, Jr. (1915–1981), while he was attending the Virginia Military Institute. Purchased. (50052)

Balducci, Giotto R. 2 photographs and 10 leaves.

Photographs, 1945, of Giotto R. Balducci (1924–2003) of Hanover County, Virginia, while he was serving in the United States Navy during World War II. This accession also includes a paper, undated, on the Iwo Jima campaign written by his son, Stan Balducci. Gift of Stan Balducci, Mechanicsville. (45581)

Clay, Robert Young. 74.5 cubic feet.

Papers, 1789–2010, of Robert Young Clay (1936–2010) of Richmond, Virginia, including his research on the Clay family and allied lines, subject files, speeches, pension records of soldiers from Smith County, Tennessee, and artwork. The bulk of the collection covers the years 1920 to 2007. Gift of the Estate of Robert Young Clay, Dinwiddie. (45033).

Cowan, Edmund. 4 pages.

Letter, 3 October 1864, from Edmund Cowan (1827–1894) of Company G, 14th South Carolina Infantry to his brother Charles Wesley Cowan (1829–1893) describing his stay at the officers' hospital in Richmond, Virginia, while recovering from a leg wound, and complaining about the slowness of his recovery. He also says that he sent for his wife, Sarah Jane Cowan (1841–1917), and comments on their family. Purchased. (50036)

Dee, Thomas W. 3 pages.

Letter, 2 September 1862, from Thomas W. Dee (1837–1910) to his mother while he was serving aboard the U.S. Steamer *Coeur de Lion* on the Potomac River. He writes about the Confederate efforts to regain their battery around Aquia Creek, the destruction of bridges over the Rappahannock River, the burning of public property by Union forces, and the blowing up of a powder mill at Fredericksburg. Dee comments on the expectation that Confederate forces will attempt to defend what remains in order to capture Washington, D.C. Purchased. (50034)

Dunn, John T. 4 pages.

Letter, 9 March [1862], from John T. Dunn at Camp Baker, Washington D.C., to his friend Jeremiah describing how Union gunboats drove off Confederate batteries that were blockading the Potomac River. Purchased. (50026)

Edwards, Alexander G. 3 pages.

Letter, 8 April 1864, from Alexander G. Edwards (b. ca. 1835), while he was held prisoner at Fort McHenry, Maryland, to Catherine “Kate” M. Morfit (1830–1906) in Baltimore. Edwards acknowledges receipt of her letter, comments on her brother Dr. Charles M. Morfit (1838–1925) and his future in the medical profession, and confirms that he has not yet been exchanged. Purchased. (50032)

Everill, Stinson P. 4 pages.

Letter, 6 December 1861, from Stinson P. Everill (d. 1862) of Battery G, 1st Pennsylvania Light Artillery, to Sadie describing the unit’s collection of foodstuffs and capture of prisoners who were potential spies. He informs her of female spies imprisoned at Leesburg, Virginia, and of a Unionist mother and daughter in difficult straits. Everill recalls happier times and sends greetings to friends. Purchased. Fenn, Austin. 36 pages.

Letters, 1862–1865, from Austin Fenn (1837–1897), Company H, 10th Vermont Infantry, to his wife, Julia Fenn (1841–1915) of Weston, Windsor County, Vermont, discussing camp life, his company and regiment including his fellow soldiers, picket duty, fighting and campaigns, rebel desertions, and generals. He also writes about his farm, offering advice concerning its care; and comments on his community’s contribution of soldiers. Purchased. (45585)

Fitchett, Leona Robbins. .45 cubic feet.

Collection, 1944–1945, kept by Leona Robbins (later Fitchett) of Norfolk, Virginia, consisting chiefly of letters, drawings, and photographs sent to her by Headmistress Mary Norton and various pen pals at Carbrooke Junior School in Thetford, Norfolk, England. Miss Norton’s letters express gratitude for Leona’s interest in her children, and often speak enthusiastically about interactions between the school and the American soldiers stationed nearby. The children’s letters describe day-to-day life in the village of Carbrooke, and are full of questions about Leona’s life; the children were anxious to compare families, schools, holiday schedules, and recreational activities.

They also make reference occasionally to war-related incidents and concerns, including the fact that several of them were evacuees from London fleeing German bombings. Gift of Leona Robbins Fitchett, Henrico. (50068)

Fogle, Robert Louis. 10 leaves and 2 photographs.

Reminiscences, undated, of Robert Louis Fogle (b. 1924) of Culpeper, Virginia, concerning his service in the United States Navy during World War II, including aboard the U.S.S. *Franklin*. Fogle recounts the destruction the ship suffered from a Japanese attack on 19 March 1945. Also included are photographs, a newspaper clipping about the attack, and a U.S.S. *Franklin* license plate holder. Gift of Sandra McGlothlin, Culpeper. (45588)

Fortney, Carl R. 18 volumes.

Notebooks, 1964–1978, of Carl R. Fortney (1915–1986) of Richmond, Virginia, detailing his work for the Bureau of Industrial Hygiene, Virginia Department of Health, and consisting of addresses, clippings, contact information, flow charts, lists, maps, minutes, notes, reports, schematics, sketches, and loose papers. The notebooks contain his notes from inspections of various manufacturers, plants, businesses, and local health departments throughout Virginia. Includes some minutes for the Regional Air Pollution Advisory Board. Gift of Jan Jennier of Bowie, Maryland. (41532)

Gaines, James Randolph Wiley. 2 photographs and 3 compact discs.

Photographs, 1941, of James Randolph Wiley Gaines (1914–2011) of Lynchburg, Virginia, who served with the 406th Ordnance Medium Maintenance Company during World War II. There is one photograph of Gaines in uniform, and one photograph of his future wife, Maxine Odessa Pannell (1924–2011). Also included in this accession is a scanned copy of *Historical and Pictorial Review, 99th Coast Artillery (AA), Camp Davis, 1941*, which contains a history of the antiaircraft training center, and photographs of its buildings, staff, and troops. Graves, Asa W. 9 pages.

Estate inventory, 2 April 1840, of Asa W. Graves (d. 1840) of Madison County, Virginia, listing slaves and personal property including furniture, linens, cookware, farming equipment, livestock, and crops, along with a monetary appraisal of each. Also includes a scanned copy of the item on CD-ROM. Gift of Sally Bonham Mohle, Glen Allen. (45439)

Hanscom, Isaiah. 2 pages.

Letter, 3 January 1864, from Isaiah Hanscom (1815–1880) at Norfolk, Virginia, to his father-in-law Joseph Frost (1791–1880) of Eliot, Maine, concerning Hanscom's work at the Norfolk Naval Yard, conditions in occupied Norfolk, African American troops, General Benjamin Butler (1818–1893), and family news. He mentions his wife, Sarah (1812–1865), and son Meldon LeRoy (1843–1919). Purchased. (45586)

Hicks, John F. 1 leaf.

Letter, 2 January 1865, from John F. Hicks (ca. 1832–1892), while he was being held prisoner at Point Lookout, Maryland, to his cousin, requesting money. Purchased. (50033)

Hundley Family. 2.475 cubic feet.

Papers, 1817–1995, of the Hundley family of Essex County, Virginia, consisting of correspondence, deeds, estate papers, financial papers, genealogical notes and charts, guardianship papers, legal papers, plats, sermons, surveys, wills, and other papers regarding the Hundley family and its home, Rose Hill. Collection also includes the papers of Louis Kuindz of Essex County, including correspondence, receipts, naturalization papers, books, and other papers. Gift of Margaret Hundley Davis, Center Cross. Kelly, John Payne. 3 pages.

Will, 5 July 1866, and memorandums, 14 February 1868 and 13 May 1869, of John Payne Kelly (1789–1871) of Culpeper County, Virginia, dividing his estate between his son and his grandchildren. Donor information unavailable. (50127)

LeSturgeon, Martha H. 6 volumes.

Collection, 1813–1814 and 1853–1880, of Martha H. LeSturgeon of Farmville, Virginia, relating to the Miller family of Cumberland County, Virginia. Includes a War of 1812 company book and orderly book of Captain John Miller (ca. 1783–1858), and a medical notebook, ledgers, and daybooks of Dr. John Thomas Miller (b. ca. 1821). Gift of Martha H. LeSturgeon, Farmville. (50041)

Mann, William Wilberforce. 2 pages.

Poem, 23 November 1865, by William Wilberforce Mann (1809–1885) entitled “Tribute to a Hero,” comparing Union General William T. Sherman (1820–1891) unfavorably with Confederate General Wade Hampton (1818–1902). Donor information unavailable. (50122)

Metcalf, Wilbur Stevens, Jr. 53 pages.

Papers, 1941–1953, of Wilbur Stevens Metcalf, Jr. (1918–) of Lynchburg, Virginia, while he was serving in the 17th Airborne Division during World War II. The collection includes enlistment records, correspondence concerning appointments and promotions, certificates, separation notice and discharge papers, and photographs. Gift of Wilbur S. Metcalf, Jr., Lynchburg. (50018)

Moran, Timothy A. 12 leaves.

Papers, 1944–1993, of Timothy A. Moran (1914–2000) of Richmond, Virginia, who served with the 463rd Parachute Field Artillery Battalion during World War II. Includes a photograph, certificates, and a unit history. Gift of Jane Moran, Richmond. (45589)

Moseley, Albert. 7 pages.

Letter, 9 July 1864, from Albert Moseley of Company B (veteran), 2nd Rhode Island Infantry, to James Moseley of Portland, Maine, providing James with information about Company D, 2nd Rhode Island Infantry, since he mustered out, including its combination with Company B. Albert also talks about the siege of Petersburg and mentions Thomas Parker, a future Medal of Honor winner. Purchased. (50037)

Mountcastle Family. 11 pages.

Papers, 1898 and 1909, of the Mountcastle family of Newport News and New Kent County, Virginia, consisting of a bill of sale, 14 January 1898, for the schooner *Amanda Robinson* from Robert E. Drake of Smithfield, Virginia, and William Mason to Albert Braxton Edmonds (1878–1918) of Newport News; and letters, 10 and 24 April 1909, from Joseph Spotswood[?] Pomfret of Covington, Kentucky, to Adeline Lafayette Pomfrey Mountcastle (1852–1937) of New Kent County concerning Pomfret/Pomfrey family history. Gift of Susan Liden of Gulf Shores, Alabama. (45513)

Nordlinger, Zelda Kingoff. 1 oversize frame with mounted buttons.

Political campaign buttons, late 1960s to 1990s, collected by Zelda Kingoff Nordlinger (1932–2008), reflecting political campaigns at the state (Virginia) and national levels. Also contains buttons advocating various causes. Added to accession 31719. Gift of Sharon Nordlinger of New York, New York. (45329)

Nordlinger, Zelda Kingoff. 21 reels. (*Misc. Reels 6055–6075*)

Journals, 1985–2008, of Zelda Kingoff Nordlinger (1932–2008) of Richmond, Virginia, consisting of abstracts of books, articles, columns, reviews, and other writings from newspapers, magazines, books, and essays covering a wide range of topics including women and society; sex, sexual roles, and sexual violence; violence, including gang, gun, and drug violence; politics, including finance and corruption; health care costs, including Medicare, Medicaid, and Social Security; liberalism and conservatism; the military; religion, including Christianity, Islam, and Judaism; terrorism; Richmond and Virginia; and other subjects. Orebaugh Family. .45 cubic feet.

Papers, 1792–1913, of the Orebaugh family of Augusta County, Virginia, namely John Orebaugh (1799–1872) and his son George A. Orebaugh (1818–1891). Includes accounts and receipts, agreements, correspondence, deeds, estate papers, memorandum book, plats and surveys, promissory notes, and tax tickets and receipts. Purchased. (45594)

Peters, William E. 2 leaves.

Invitation, 10 September 1859, to attend a debate of the Hermesian Society of Emory and Henry College, addressed to William E. Peters (1829–1906), professor of ancient languages and literature. Purchased. (50029)

Pleasants, James. 1 leaf.

Receipt, 19 December 1861, from Lieutenant James Pleasants (1831–1898) of the Hampden Artillery to Captain Fleming Saunders (1829–1907) of the 42nd Virginia Infantry for a wagon, four horses, and four harnesses. Purchased. (50031)

Rollins, Philip M. 30 pages.

Letters, 1863–1865, from Philip Rollins of Company G, 19th Maine Infantry, and Artillery Brigade, 2nd Corps, to his sister Martha Jane, detailing military life; his service; family news; military news, including the siege of Petersburg; desertions; and his wish to be home. Rollins mentions Generals Ulysses S. Grant and Benjamin Butler, as well as Abraham Lincoln and the election of 1864. Collection also contains an incomplete letter from “Sid” to unknown, discussing military life. The back of one letter includes the lyrics of “Our Cavalry.” Purchased. (50038)

Smith, William S. 1 leaf.

Letter, 26 October 1864, from Captain William S. Smith (1830–1903) commanding at Camp Sycamore, Logan County, West Virginia, to General John C. Breckenridge (1821–1875) concerning the purchase and sale of tobacco, cattle, hogs, and dry goods, and requesting medical supplies for Smith’s surgeon, B. C. Randall. Purchased. (45587)

Spencer, Joseph Allen. 2 photographs.

Photographs, 1943, of Joseph Allen Spencer (1917–2011) of Roanoke, Virginia, while he was serving with the 861st Engineer Aviation Battalion during World War II. One photograph is a portrait of Spencer, and the other is a panoramic image of his unit. Gift of Larry Spencer, Richmond. (50042)

Stewart, Robert S. .7 cubic feet.

Letters, 1943–1946, of Robert S. Stewart (b. 1924) of Parker’s Landing, Armstrong County, Pennsylvania, to his parents and siblings while he was serving aboard the U.S.S. *Kyne* during World War II. Gift of Robert S. Stewart, Fishersville. (45570)

Sutton, Susanna Frances Baylor. 1 leaf and 2 pages.

Letters, 1835, of Susanna Frances Baylor Sutton (1783–1837) of Caroline County, Virginia, consisting of a letter, 10 July 1835, from Sutton to James Ewell Heath (1792–1862) of Richmond, Virginia, discussing the possible freeing of slaves and their immigration to Liberia; and a letter, 18 July 1835, from Heath to David J. Burr (ca. 1783–1838), forwarding Susanna Sutton’s letter. Transferred. (50125)

Switzer, Charles Williams. 1.8 cubic feet.

Papers, 1881–1927, of Charles Williams Switzer (1854–1928) of Botetourt County, Virginia, consisting of surveys, deeds, and plats for real property in Botetourt, Alleghany, Craig, and Rockbridge Counties; land warrants for land acquired in Botetourt County; accounts, receipts, judicial and legal papers, election tallies, drafts, poems, and advertisements. Purchased. (45118)

Wiley, H. A. 4 pages.

Letter, 30 April 1863, from H. A. Wiley of Company B, 104th New York Infantry to his brother describing the movements of the Army of the Potomac leading up to the Battle of Chancellorsville. Purchased. (50035)

Wilson, Owen Thomas. 25 leaves, photocopies.

Papers, 1943–1993, of Owen Thomas Wilson (1922–1943) of Bland County, Virginia, who was killed in action on 22 April 1943 on Funafuti Atoll while serving with the Army Air Force's 371st Bomb Squadron. The collection includes a letter from a comrade giving an account of Wilson's death, and from military personnel regarding the disposition of his remains, clippings from published sources, biographical information, photographs, and military citations posthumously awarded to him.
