

Pamunkey Employment, Petition, 1711

Whereas Richard Littlepage of the County of New Kent Gent hath made Application to me for a Licence to hire and employ one man of the Pamunkey Indians to hunt for him, and also one Woman of the said Nation named Mary in the nature of a hired Servant, and hath given bond to answer all Damage the said Indian man shall do in his hunting to any of his Majestys Subjects;

These are therefore to License and permit the said Richard Littlepage to hire and employ the said Indian man and Woman: Provided that Whenever the Queen of Pamunkey shall recall them or either of them, the said Richard Littlepage shall immediately dismiss them from his Service, and not harbour or entertain them hereafter, without a new Licence, and the Consent of the said Queen first obtained. Given under my hand this 25th day of October 1711.
