The volume contains a descriptive list of the unit's members, a roll of arms and ammunition furnished to each soldier, and dates of various activities of each soldier are also noted. The book was later used by William Sawyer (1808-1892) of Buxton, Maine, and contains farm accounts and memoranda covering the years 1880 to 1888. Purchased. (51755)

Orderly book, 1814-1815, of Captain James Watson's cavalry company in the 63<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of the Virginia militia. The volume includes muster and pay rolls, morning reports, general orders, provision and forage returns, lists and dates of substitutes, farrier work done, and court-martial proceedings, including those of Captain Watson, who was discharged from service on 23 January 1815. The book was later used by Samuel Scott of Prince Edward County. There are accounts, lists of foaled dates of horses and sheep markings, medicinal recipes and a table of medicines for family use with dosage amounts, and Scott notes the death dates of his father and brother. **Anderson, Jacob H.** .45 cubic feet and 1 volume.

Papers, 1833-1875, of Jacob H. Anderson (1814-1857) of Campbell County, Virginia, including accounts and receipts, bonds and promissory notes, correspondence, fee bills, guardian accounts, muster fines, orders for payments or goods, slave bills of sale, hire bonds, and a patrol order, summons, and tax tickets. There is also a ledger containing cash accounts from 9 June to 6 September 1835, and a journal of activities on Anderson's plantation "Greenwood," covering the period January to June 1857. Letters, 1919, to Walter B. Anderson (1898-1977) of Richmond, Virginia, consisting of letters from Morgan R. Mills, Jr. (1894-1962), J. Vaughan Gary (1892-1973), and Dave E. Satterfield (1894-1946) concerning donations Anderson requested; and a letter from E. A. Wright Company of Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, regarding proposed commencement invitations for Richmond College. Purchased. (51109)

**Carter, Willis M.** 8.52 cubic feet.

Papers, ca. 1894-2016, of Willis McGlascoe Carter (1852–1902), an African American newspaper editor in Staunton, Virginia, consisting of a journal, ca. 1894, by Carter; issue, 1 September 1894, of Carter's newspaper the *Staunton Tribune*; and a memorial, 1902, written by Carter's fellow teachers at Public School #2 in Staunton at Carter's death. Collection also contains additional research notes and materials gathered by Deborah Harding, Cuesta Benberry, and Margaret Rhett including articles, interviews, maps, photographs, and court and federal records for the book *From Slave to Statesman: the Life of Educator, Editor, and Civil Rights Activist Willis M. Carter of Virginia* by Robert Heinrich and Deborah Harding, foreword by Henry Louis Gates Jr., published by LSU Press May 2016. Collection also contains papers of Cuesta Benberry (1923-2007) of St. Louis, Missouri, who discovered the Carter journal. **Chalkley, Lyman.** 5.4 cubic feet.

Papers, 1816-1922, of Judge Lyman Chalkley (1861-1934) of Covington and Staunton, Virginia, including correspondence and subject files. The bulk of the collection covers the years 1890-1903. The correspondence is both personal and professional in subject matter. There are many letters written by his wife Eleanor Desha (Breckinridge) Chalkley (1862-1943) while she was in Lexington, Kentucky and Washington, D.C. The subject files include financial records, commonplace and memorandum books, legal notes and suit papers, and other materials. Gift of the Augusta County Circuit Court, Staunton. (51713)

**Churchill, Edmund F.** 58 pages.

Letters, 1863-1864, from Edmund F. Churchill (1842-1921) of Company E, 18<sup>th</sup> Massachusetts Infantry, to his father Isaiah Churchill (1806-1882) and his sister Charlotte Churchill (Plummer) (1835-1904) in Plympton, Plymouth County, Massachusetts. Churchill writes about his company and the battles he has been in, including a detailed description of the battle of Chancellorsville, as well as his activities and camp life during non-combat times, including exploring a gold mine in Fauquier County, Virginia. He adds information on casualties and his departure from the army, including a description of his trip up the Chesapeake Bay and Potomac River to Washington D.C. He comments on his family, including his recovery of the knapsacks of his brothers Frederick (1840-1862) and Isaiah ("Frank") (1842-1919) and his father Isaiah's (1806-1882) marriage. Purchased. **Cosby, Lewise Overton.** .45 cubic feet.

Papers, 1938-2000, of Lewise Overton Cosby (1914-1986) of Louisa County, Virginia, relating to her involvement in the Society of the Descendants of Peter Francisco. The collection includes brochures, booklets, clippings, genealogical notes, photographs, proclamations, and programs. Gift of Karen Kardian, Richmond. (51740)

**Drolsbaugh, James.** 8 pages.

Letters, 6, 10, and 22 December 1862, from James Drolsbaugh (1832-1870), 1<sup>st</sup> sergeant in Company F, 171<sup>st</sup> Pennsylvania Regiment, in Suffolk, Virginia, to his wife Belle Drolsbaugh in Juniata County, Pennsylvania. Drolsbaugh provides news of himself and his regiment, including camp life and health. Drolsbaugh states that the regiment has no doctor and has a poor preacher. He adds that some officers had been using the regiment's rations to pay local African Americans for work. Drolsbaugh describes Suffolk and its African American population. He offers his wife advice about their farm and about vaccinations for her and their daughter. Purchased. (51752)

**Ewing, Elbert William Robinson.** .45 cubic feet.

Typescript draft, 1916, of "The Pioneer Gateway of the Cumberlands: History of the Settlement of Powell Valley, Lee County, Virginia and Claiborne County, Tennessee" by Elbert William Robinson Ewing (1867-1928) of Falls Church, Virginia. The work was never published. Ewing discusses the westward expansion beyond the Alleghany Mountains, including the marking of the Wilderness Road along the Powell Valley along the eastern base of the Cumberland Mountains. Gift of the Handley Regional Library, Winchester. (51728)

**Fridley, Marshall E.** .225 cubic feet.

Papers, 1964-1968, of Marshall E. Fridley (1918-1989) of Craigsville, Augusta County, Virginia, concerning a labor grievance with the Lehigh Portland Cement Company, as well as materials related to the Ku Klux Klan, including constitution and by-laws, minutes of a state meeting, and newsletters. Gift of Katherine D. Walker, Richmond. (51744)

Letter, undated, from J. B. G. in Brodnax, Brunswick County, Virginia, to his wife telling her he misses her and their baby, describing a trip to Norfolk, Virginia, and commenting on events in and around Brodnax. Purchased. (51112)

Papers, 1728-1990, of Martha Eheart King (1923-2013) of Warrenton, Virginia, including research files for her two books *Harlow-Harlowe: Descendants of Henry Martin and Mary Elizabeth (Hawley) Harlow* (1980) and "*Dear Bennie*": *Letters of Mollie (Slusher) Garr and Alice Garr of Lafayette County, Missouri to William Benjamin Plunkett of Greene County, Virginia, 1880-1896* (1982), as well as Plunkett family papers and subject files. Papers, 1922-1952, of Robert Bolling Lambeth, Sr., (1915-1999) of Bedford, Virginia, consisting of a letter, 15 August 1922, from Samuel M. Ware (1836-1906) at Waterview, Middlesex County, Virginia, to his sister-in-law Mary Susan Latane Sale (b. ca. 1852) in Essex County, Virginia, announcing that his wife "Nannie," Ann Elizabeth Burwell Latane Ware, (1842-1916) gave birth to a son. Ware invites Sale to visit and to bring her newborn son along. Purchased. (51111)
