ORGANIZATION RECORDS

Old Dominion Postcard Club. 1.8 cubic feet.

Records, 1979-2017, of the Old Dominion Postcard Club are primarily comprised of the club's monthly newsletter, the Virginia Deltiologist. Newsletters include information about club members, club meetings and events, and interesting stories about postcards. Also included in the newsletters are articles about the history and symbolism of postcards, as well as local and national newspaper articles regarding postcards and postcard collecting. This collection also includes membership directories, the club's constitution and by-laws, rules regarding the club's annual postcard exhibit, fliers, correspondence, and general papers. [-----], **Edward.** 4 pages.

Letter, 1 August 1861, from Edward to Miss P. P. C. Jones of Amherst County, Virginia. Edward writes about the aftermath of the first battle of Manassas (Bull Run), including the dead and wounded still on the field. He talks about the poor quality of the camp food and of the devastation of the countryside by the Union army. Purchased. (52569)

Allison, William H. 2 leaves and 4 pages.

Papers, 1865, of William H. Allison (1838-1904) of Richmond, Virginia, and captain of Company H, 25th Virginia Infantry Battalion, consisting of his discharge from Johnson's Island prison and oath of allegiance, 18 June 1865; petition for pardon, 10 August 1865; and amnesty oath and certificate, 14 August 1865. Purchased. (52572)

Bell, J. M. 8 pages.

Letters, 1847-1848, from J. M. Bell of the Virginia Regiment to John W. Luke (1815-1896) of Loudoun County, Virginia. Letter, 17 February 1847, from Richmond, Virginia, describes a flag presentation ceremony, discusses the selection of a chief surgeon, and comments on politics. Letter, 12 April 1848, from Parras, Mexico, describes the camp and landscape around Parras, as well as the sport of throwing bulls by the tail; and comments on peace. Bell also remarks on personal and political news. Purchased. (52547)

Brooks, Andrew. 4 pages.

Letter, 22 August 1861, from Andrew Brooks, Company I, 4th Virginia Infantry, at Camp Harman, Fairfax County, to his cousin Mary, providing details of daily life and events in camp, as well as a brief discussion of the first battle of Manassas or Bull Run. Purchased. (52562)

Duke, W. D. 1 leaf and 2 pages.

Letter, 6 January 1908, from W. D. Duke (1872-1951) Assistant to the President, Richmond, Fredericksburg, and Potomac Railroad Company, to Estelle Courtney (1862-1950) of Richmond, Virginia, sending her a copy of an old survey made 12 March 1851 for property located near Laurel in Henrico County, Virginia. The survey had been found in a desk used by her father, T. L. Courtney (1824-1908). Purchased. (52552)

Garber Family. 1.35 cubic feet.

Papers, 1871-1985, of the Garber family of Augusta County, Virginia, consist of photograph albums, cabinet card photographs, diaries and scrapbooks, and general papers. The photographs and photograph albums depict members of the Garber and Glick families, their homes and other property, as well as their travels. Scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings relating to the Garber family and the Church of the Brethren, as well as Garber genealogical information, handwritten notes, postcards, receipts, and other ephemera. Diaries and other notebooks detail the daily life of 20th century members of the Garber family, and record important familial and local events. General papers include broadsides advertising community events, a program from the 1928 commemoration of Abraham Garber, and papers relating to elections and council meetings of the town of New Hope. George, Marion Dillon and David Pelham. 13.45 cubic feet.

Papers, 1993-2019, of Marion Dillon George and David Pelham George consist of their research on the George and Dillon families and associated lines. Collection contains correspondence, notes, vital records, family trees, and genealogical charts, and includes information on lines which settled in numerous Virginia counties including Amelia, Caroline, Chesterfield, Cumberland, Franklin, Frederick, Goochland, Hanover, Henrico, and Louisa, as well as Kentucky, Missouri, Washington, North Carolina, Tennessee, and West Virginia. Collection also contains applications, newsletters, directories, and certificates from historical and genealogical societies, and details their family lineage from pre-colonial America. Also included in the collection is a 1928 yearbook from John Marshall High School, called the "Marshallite". Gift of Marion Dillon George, Richmond. (52619)

Haden, John M. 6 pages.

Letters, 6 April and 5 June 1864, from John M. Haden (ca. 1841-1864) of Company G, 5th Virginia Cavalry, to his wife Peggie Haden in Fluvanna County, Virginia. Haden writes about how much he misses his wife and children, as well as about news from home. He writes about life in camp and notes that General Robert E. Lee (1807-1870) had inspected the troops at Bottom's Bridge, Virginia. Purchased. (52561)

Harrison, John P. 2 leaves.

Letter, 30 March 1847, from John P. Harrison (b. ca. 1804) of Hanover County, Virginia, to his son John P. Harrison (1831-1861) living with his grandfather in Henrico County, Virginia. Harrison comments on difficulties at his son's school, the weather and crops, and news regarding the war with Mexico. Purchased. (52550)

Hassan, Henry. 3 pages.

Letter, 26 September 1861 from Henry Hasson (ca. 1842-1863) of Company F, Baxter's Fire Zouaves (72nd Pennsylvania Infantry), to his brother Thomas Hassan (ca. 1839-1876) in Wilmington, Delaware, discussing camp life and a skirmish with Confederate troops near Falls Church, Virginia. Purchased. (52566)

Howlett, Edwin James. 4 pages.

Letter, 14 September 1862, probably from Edwin James Howlett of Company I, 10th Virginia Cavalry, Wise's Legion, at Winchester, Virginia, to his new wife Brittanica D. Long Howlett (1836-1902) in Manchester, Virginia, detailing his efforts to return to his company during the Maryland Campaign of September 1862. He informs her that the Confederate army is moving to capture Harper's Ferry, currently held by Union troops. He also notes that Jefferson Davis (1808-1889) is in Winchester. Purchased. (52564)

Hubbel, R. A. 4 pages.

Letter, 17 December 1862, from R. A. Hubbel (1833-1868) of Company K, 14th New York Infantry, to his parents, describing his regiment's actions during the battle of Fredericksburg, 11-15 December 1862. Hubbel describes the fighting he was engaged in and comments on casualties. He notes that the Union army withdrew from Fredericksburg after the defeat. Purchased. (52571)

Krauth, Julia Heiskell. 4 pages.

Letter, 26 July 1845, from Julia Heiskell Krauth (1821-1858) in Clarke County, Virginia, to her brother Charles Porterfield Krauth (1823-1883) in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania, describing her stay in Clarke County. She also discusses her future husband Ovid Americus Kinsolving (1822-1894). Julia Krauth signs her letter Julia O. Americus. Purchased. (52554)

Linthicum, C. F. 4 pages.

Letter, 7 January 1861, from C. F. Linthicum, in Prince William County, Virginia, to "Lizzie," commenting on Christmas and the religious import of the day. He regrets that people do not seem to recall the day with the proper reverence, but are swept up in the secession crisis. He believes the Union will crumble, but hopes that there will not be civil war. Purchased. (52568)

Meek, Samuel. 2 leaves.

Deed, 14 September 1826, for two slaves, Lucrecy age 26 years and Jane age about 18 months, from Samuel Meek (ca. 1804-1836) of Washington County, Virginia to Margaret Ward (1796-1864) of Wythe County, Virginia. Also included is a second page that appears to have been written on the back of a picture frame that once held the deed, lamenting the sale of two humans for \$490.00. The second leaf is undated. Gift of Diana White, Charlotte, North Carolina. (52666)

Morton, Jackson. 4 pages.

Letter, 21 November 1846, from Jackson Morton (1794-1874) in Richmond, Virginia, to John Hunt of Santa Rosa County, Florida, commenting on the slave market in Richmond. He critically notes Virginians' response to war with Mexico. Morton, a Whig, is also critical of James K. Polk (1795-1849). Purchased. (52548)

Mumaw, William. 2 pages.

Agreement, 24 January 1863, between William Mumaw and Levi Lutz (1828-1883), both of Shenandoah County, Virginia, in which Mumaw agrees to serve as a substitute for Lutz in the Confederate army for pay and a bridle and saddle. Purchased. (52560)

Page, Henry D. 3 leaves and 4 pages.

Letter, 24 December 1847, from Henry D. Page (1821-1891), pay clerk with the United States army in Mexico City, Mexico, to B. B. Clark of Franklin, New Hampshire, describing Mexico City, including the Halls of Montezuma (Chapultepec Castle), the cathedral, the hospital, and the canal. He describes the surrounding area, including the route taken by the army under General Winfield Scott. Page notes that while the city is interesting and busy, he is anxious to leave. Purchased. (52546)

Sult, Jane. 2 pages.

Relief note, 8 February 1864, for Jane Sult, wife of John Sult (d. 1865) of Company B, 45th Virginia Infantry, paying her \$4 in benefits from the Wythe County, Virginia, treasurer. Purchased. (52567)

Thompson, A. F. 2 pages.

Letter, 5 April 1865, from A. F. Thompson (1835-1924) of Company F, 8th Connecticut Infantry, in Richmond, Virginia, to his brother-in-law George Champlin of Hartford Connecticut, regarding his excitement to be in the captured capital of the Confederacy. Purchased. (52563)

Wallace, R. 5 pages.

Letter, 30 June 1846, from R. Wallace of Warrenton, Virginia, to Congressman James McDowell (1795-1851) regarding Wallace's chances for a commission as a general in the war with Mexico. Purchased. (52549)

Wright, Mary. 1.35 cubic feet.

Papers, 1876-1919, of Mary L. Wright consist of correspondence, advertisements, price lists, receipts, invoices, and contracts related to the management of the Wrights' unnamed general store. Collection also includes several miscellaneous art prints and notes. Purchased. (52190)
