Topics included are State Wages and Hours law, State Labor Relations Act, adequate teachers' pay, abolition of the poll tax, and rate increases of the Chesapeake and Potomac Telephone Company. Letters, 1863-1865, written by William F. Dusenberry, a soldier in the 9th West Virginia Regiment, to his daughter Susan Evelyn Dusenberry Clark (1848-1931). Letters were written by Dusenberry in Winchester, Virginia and Washington, D.C. and were sent to his family's home in Cabell County, West Virginia. Letters detail family and farm life, economic hardships, his concerns for his family regarding the Confederate Army, and briefly mention President Lincoln's Emancipation Proclamation. Purchased. Echols Family. 2.86 cubic feet.

Papers, 1818-1999, of the Echols family of Rockbridge County and Lynchburg, Virginia, and Fayette County, West Virginia, consisting of accounts, advertisements, calling cards, catalogs, checks, correspondence, deeds, genealogical notes, photographs, receipts, tax records, and other papers detailing the family's personal and business interests, including their activities in the coal industry, retail, and medical profession. Also contains correspondence and papers relating to Ernest Echols' sons' education at the Virginia Military Institute. Research material, 1939-2018, on Tommy Edwards (1922-1969) of Henrico County, Virginia, collected by Donald W. Gunter in preparation of a biography for the Dictionary of Virginia Biography. Collection includes biographical information on Edwards' life and career as a songwriter and singer; chart information on songs that Edwards wrote or sung; information on and recordings of Edwards' albums and records; power points and related materials for talks and interviews on Edwards by Donald W. Papers, 1953-2017, of Louise A. Hutchinson are primarily comprised of newspaper clippings of her work from the Chicago Tribune. The newspaper clippings span the entire length of her time working at the Tribune, from 1953-1973, and include articles written by Hutchinson about animals, Alvin the Submarine, Hutchinson's trip to the Antarctic, miscellaneous features and local interest articles from Washington, D.C. and Chicago, school desegregation, and various politicians, including John F. Kennedy, Lyndon B. Johnson, Richard Nixon, and their families. Collection also includes correspondence, and several photograph albums and scrapbooks that detail various aspects of her time as a reporter for the Chicago Tribune. Also included in this collection is a 1994 oral history of Hutchinson, conducted by Chicago Tribune reporter Robert Wiedrich, as well as miscellaneous papers and photographs. Letters, 1942-1944, from Russell L. Leonard (1914-1997) to his wife Florence Edna Leonard (1916-1997) while he was stationed in Norfolk and Richmond as Shore Patrol for the U.S. Navy. Letters detail the daily life and duties of Leonard while he worked as a shore patrolman, descriptions of Norfolk and Richmond, concerns about his wife's daily life and economics, and his plans for the future. Mayne, John R. 2 pages.

Letter, 29 July 1920, from John R. Mayne (ca. 1870-1959) writing from New York, to his wife, Mary S. "Mayme" Mayne (1877-1958) in Richmond, describing the classes that he was taking in New York and the fact that he was the only African American in at least one of them. He also mentions the large number of African Americans from Georgia who have moved to New York and his wish that his wife take a course in Sociology. Gift of Nathaniel Wooding, Midlothian, Virginia. Meagher, Margie. 27 leaves and 2 pages.

Letters, 1975-1975, written to Seaman Apprentice Margie Meagher who was stationed at the Naval Air Station Oceana in Virginia Beach and worked in the administration department of the VF-101. Letters were written by Dave Allen, Michael D. Price, and M.V. Smith, sailors aboard the USS Forrestal, and contain details of the sailors' daily lives. Purchased. (52407)

Ruefly, Leon. .45 cubic feet.

Letters, 1968-1970 and 1980-1981, written by Leon S. K. Ruefly (1935-1999) to his stepmother Pauline Starke Ruefly (1901-1981) while he served two sentences in prison. Letters dating from 1968-1970 were sent from detention centers in Maryland, and letters dating from 1980-1981 were sent from detention centers in Virginia. Letters detail Ruefly's daily life, trials and convictions, his health, and his economic hardships. Collection also includes a letter from his first wife Kathleen Gwen Ruefly and a letter from Peggy B. Baines. Purchased. (52630)

Scully Family. .175 cubic feet.

Letters, 1941-1942, to Paul Reeves Scully (1916-1977) of Norfolk, Virginia, from his mother Lulu Artie Ford Scully (1880-1956) and his sister Mildred Elizabeth Scully (1911-1996) of Fairmont, Marion County, West Virginia, concerning Paul's move to Norfolk, family and local news from Fairmont, and the attack on Pearl Harbor and the United States entrance into World War II.
