Enclosures include obituaries; census records; an 1847 indenture; Civil War service and pension records; and a marriage certificate, 1928, for Berkley Z. Clarke (1881–1958) and Mary Alice Hovey. Fauquier County, Virginia, 1754–1848. Bible of Dudley Fitzhugh (1789–1848). Bible printed in 1812. Also included is a family tree for the descendants of William Fitzhugh (1754–1817), father of Dudley, through his daughters Sarah Fitzhugh Edmonds and Elizabeth Fitzhugh Gordon. Richmond, Virginia, 1850–1977. Includes Bible records (3 p.) and enclosures (4 items). Other surnames mentioned: Groom, Herndon, Pennell, and Rodgers. Enclosures consist of an obituary for Mrs. F. J. Wright, undated; a Second Baptist Church Sunday School (Richmond, Va.) membership certificate, 1905, for Conway C. Includes Bible records (5 leaves), typed transcript of another Murden family Bible record (1 leaf), and enclosures (4 leaves). Enclosures include two report cards for Ethel Everton (b. 1914) from Norfolk Public Schools (Oak Grove). Gift of Floyd Steven West, Virginia Beach. (45447)

King William County, Virginia, 1822–1907. Bible of Robert Milton Neale (1822–1880) and Mary Ellen Smith Neale (1828–1886). Bible printed in 1850. Fairfax and Loudoun Counties, Virginia, 1739–1981. Bible of Benjamin Shreve Simpson (1845–1898). Includes Bible records (6 leaves) and additional information about Benjamin Shreve Simpson provided by the donor (1 leaf). Enclosures consist of newspaper clippings, obituaries, and a 1926 letter regarding the Metropolitan Life Insurance Company policy for Robert E. Sturdivant. Other surnames mentioned: Beiddell, Berry, Booker, Briggs, Edmonds, Edwards, Gibbs, Hartley, Jackson, Milbourn, Newsome, Parham, Spicely, and Walker. Caroline, Clarke, and Fauquier Counties, Virginia, 1651–1956. Record consists of partial information copied from multiple Bibles. One of the Bibles belonged to Francis Thornton (1651–1726), another to Thomas Catlett Thornton (1843–1910). Other portions are unidentified. Includes photocopies of original Bible pages (5 leaves) and transcripts of others (3 leaves). One of the transcript pages was made in 1953, of a Bible printed in 1672. It is unclear whether the transcripts all come from the same Bible. Other surnames mentioned: Allen, Catlett, Conway, Dade, Grant, Gray, Hart, Hope, Krone, Laughlin, Lukhard, and Sublett. Also included is the second page of the memoirs of an unidentified Thornton family member, focusing in part on the Civil War and Reconstruction era. Other surnames mentioned include: Clayton, Ford, Franklin, Gravett, Green, Heath, Long, Overby, Shotwell, Strickland, Warren, and Weatherford. Loaned for duplication by Earl Arrington, South Boston. Notes. *The Tangled Trail of Benjamin Dawson of Orange and Spotsylvania Counties, the City of Richmond and Northumberland, Fauquier and Frederick Counties in Virginia and the Trail of Benjamin Dawson's Family by His First Wife, Mary Stevens (?) Dawson and by His Second Wife, Ann (Pope) (Roy) Dawson, in Virginia, Ohio and Elsewhere.* Includes information on the identity of the Benjamin Dawson (d. ca. 1826) who married second wife Ann Pope Roy (d. ca. 1832) in 1804, attempting to differentiate him from contemporaries with the same name. Includes information on the first marriages of Benjamin and Ann Dawson; the dispute over Benjamin Dawson's will and land he owned in Ohio; his Revolutionary War service; his children with both wives; and likely candidates for his parents and siblings. The author's research indicates that this Benjamin Dawson showed up at different times in Frederick, Fauquier, Northumberland,

Orange, and Spotsylvania Counties, and Richmond, Virginia. Compiled by the donor. Gift of F. Claiborne Johnston, Jr., Richmond. (45249)

Notes. *The Tangled Trail of Two John Popes: Colonel John Pope of Amherst County, Virginia, and John Pope of Prince William County, Virginia, and Wilkes County, Georgia.* Includes information on two cousins named John Pope who have often been confused for one another in attempts to identify the author of *A Tour Through the Southern and Western Territories of the United States of North America; the Spanish Dominions on the River Mississippi and in the Floridas; the Countries of the Creek Nations and Many Uninhabited Parts* (pub. 1792). Report explores records illuminating the lives and families of each man, one John Pope (1749–1802) who likely was born in Westmoreland County, Virginia, and lived in Prince William County, Virginia, and later in Wilkes County, Georgia, where he died; the other, Colonel John Pope (ca. 1754–1795), who was born in Louisa County, Virginia, and lived in Amherst County, Virginia, and died in Augusta, Georgia. Includes copies of photographs, the will of Amanda Stone, and a tribute to Jacob Stone read by his great-granddaughter Lillie Hunt Randolph on 15 August 2010 at the 150th anniversary of New Bethel Baptist Church in Hurt, Virginia. The entries range in date from 1751–1774. Individuals named include criminals sentenced to time in the Americas, Poor House residents who volunteered to emigrate to seek their fortunes, ship masters, justices of the peace, and receiving officers. The information abstracted here includes (where applicable) the specific conviction and sentence, the designation “from the Poor House,” the date of embarkation, and the reference for finding the original entry in the Quarter Sessions documents. The list was compiled by Professor Geoffrey Brown and History Centre

Hines (1826–1912) of the 38th Virginia Infantry, Company D, mostly to his wife, Nancy Breedlove Hines, on topics including the First Battle of Bull Run; a long march of retreat from Manassas, March 1862; engaging in battle at Yorktown and Williamsburg, April and May 1862; advice for managing the family farm and slaves; troop movements, camp life, and the lack of proper nourishment; the Second Battle of Bull Run, September 1862; and the depressed spirits of the Confederate Army as it became clear that they could not win the war.
