Accounts list customer name and cost for item or service; also note payments when made. Volume includes cost for the hire of enslaved persons. Hopkins and Bro. (Accomack County, Va.). .9 cubic feet.

Business records, 1883-1915, of Hopkins and Bro. of Accomack County, Virginia, consisting of account books, bills of lading, catalogs, circulars, clippings, correspondence, invoices, notes, notices, price lists, receipts, and other documents detailing Hopkins and Bro.'s mercantile business, including as agent for the Baltimore, Chesapeake, and Atlantic Railway. J. A. Templeton and Son (Augusta County, Va.). 1 volume.

Cashbook, 1902-1904, of J. A. Templeton and Son of Staunton, Virginia, detailing receipts and disbursements of cash by the company, which sold telephones, electric appliances, and supplies. Accounts record who receipts were from and record what disbursements were for. Purchased. (53199)

Kerr, J. B. .225 cubic feet.

Store ledgers, 1893-1894, of a merchant in New Hope, Augusta County, Virginia, possibly J. B. Kerr. Ledgers contain purchase date, customer name, item or items purchased, and cost. Volume 1 covers 20 May-9 December 1893 and volume 2 covers 9 December 1893-30 June 1894. Purchased. (53471)

Newton, Gordon, Johnston and Company (Madeira). 7 pages.

Letters, June 1791, to Newton, Gordon, Johnston and Company of Madeira, from William Wilson and Company of Alexandria, Virginia, (June 18) regarding shipment of and duties on wine and shipment of wheat and flour to Newton, Gordon, Johnston; and from Baylor Hill and Company of Norfolk, Virginia, (June 21) regarding shipment of corn, wheat, and flour to Newton, Gordon, Johnson, and shipment of wine to Baylor Hill. Baylor Hill also asks that they find a buyer for the ship Jolly Tar. Purchased. (52555)

Ledger, 1797-1804, of a merchant located at Ferry Hill, Pulaski County, Virginia. Ledger contains date of purchase, customer name, items purchased, and cost. ORGANIZATION RECORDS

Confederate States of America. Army. Department of Henrico. 3 pages.

General orders no. 12 issued 31 March 1862 by the Department of Henrico, Confederate States Army, regarding the trials of John Scully (1836-1902) and Brice [Pryce] Lewis (1831-1911) on charges of spying. Both Scully and Lewis pled not guilty, but were found guilty and sentenced to hang on 4 April 1862. Purchased. (52957)

Confederate States of America. Army. Virginia Infantry Regiment, 29th. 1 leaf.

Order, 2 November 1862, from assistant adjutant general Charles E. Marshall (1821-1868) of General Humphrey Marshall's (1812-1872) staff to Colonel Alfred Cleon Moore (1805-1890) ordering the 29th Virginia Infantry to be ready to move at a moment's notice and ordering all officers and men to be brought into camp. Purchased. (52956)

Radford Reading Room (Radford, Va.). 1 volume.

Journal, 1926-1929, of the Radford Reading Room library in Radford, Virginia, operated by Wise Worrell (1882-1948) recording receipts, disbursements, accounts, donations of books and magazines, inventories, reports on use of the library, and notes on the library's operation. Volume also includes autobiographical data and notes on mathematics, geometry, and philosophy and their relationship. Gift of Wise Worrell, Radford. (20349)

Republican State Executive Committee (Va.). 2 leaves.

Circular letters, 7 and 23 October 1905, from C. B. Slemp (1870-1943) chairman of the Republican State Executive Committee to district and local leaders regarding campaigning in the last weeks of the state elections. Slemp encourages leadership to have candidates and other Republicans speak as often as possible before the elections. Purchased. (52954)

Richmond Prison Association. 1 leaf.

The Prisoners' Song, 1861, written by Captain Isaac W. Hart (ca. 1815-1873) of the 20th Indiana Infantry for the Richmond Prison Association, which consisted of captured Union army officers held in Libby Prison in Richmond, Virginia. The song captures the prisoners' hopes that they will be exchanged and free soon. The artwork was done by Lieutenant J. M. Grumman (1833-1862) of Company H, 14th New York Infantry. Purchased. Anthony family. 5 leaves and 27 pages.

Papers, 1821-1859, of the Anthony family of Campbell County, Virginia, consisting of letters to Charles Anthony (1793-1884), Morgiana Anthony (1834-1852), and Callie J. Anthony (1839-1886) from family and friends containing family and social news. Includes a letter, 4 December 1855, concerning the shipment of a piano, and an account, 1838, of Charles Anthony with Samuel Williams for blacksmithing of tools, plows, and horseshoes. Papers, 1942-1945, of J. Carlton Bowles of Franklin County, Virginia, detailing his service in World War II, including baptism certificate; orders regarding battle honors and awards; postcards of Paris, France; selective service notifications; separation reports and honorable discharge papers; and Veterans Administration papers. Letter, 21 November 1862, from William Cluxton (1837-1864) of Company E, 112th New York Infantry, to his wife Julia Camp Cluxton (1842-1910) in Erie County, Pennsylvania. Cluxton recounts the 112th's first military action in fighting near the town of Franklin, Virginia. Purchased. (52985)

Cobb, Mary Church. 4 pages.

Letter, 4 November 1865, from Mary Church Cobb (1858-1940) of Bedford County, Virginia, to her grandfather William Dickinson (1798-1881) of Kanawha County, West Virginia, stating how she and the family miss him and hope he will visit; commenting on "Miss Sue;" and providing news of family and friends. Also includes a letter from Mary Cobb's mother, Steptoe Cobb (1828-1878) to Dickinson asking why he hasn't written her, his daughter. Purchased. (52872)

Deschamps, John Baptist. 2 pages.

Certificate of naturalization, 19 September 1803, for John Baptist Deschamps, formerly of France, stating that he had satisfied the requirements of United States citizenship which was granted on 19 September 1803 in Norfolk County, Virginia. Certificate is signed by William Wilson (1760-1838), clerk of court. Purchased. (53465)

Dillard Family. .37 cubic feet.

Papers, 1771-1859, 189-, of the Dillard family of Amherst County, Virginia, consisting of circular letters, correspondence, letters to the editor, and speeches concerning local, state, and national politics; drawings, land grants, and plats regarding property in Amherst and Buckingham Counties; account books, accounts, and correspondence regarding purchases and financial matters; commissions for the 90th Virginia Militia; claims for property losses during the Civil War; and a business card for Dr. William S. Dillard. Purchased. (53160)

Erwin, L. G. 4 pages.

Letter, 3 January 1864, from L. G. Erwin (ca. 1844-1894) of Company I, 27th Massachusetts Infantry, in Norfolk, Virginia, to Thomas J. Morgan (1823-1906) of Hampden County, Massachusetts, commenting on complaints from Norfolk citizens on the 27th Massachusetts being stationed there and General Benjamin Butler's (1818-1893) response. Erwin also comments on a successful raid by two African American regiments to Elizabeth City, North Carolina. He asks about Morgan's health and notes that Brimfield, Massachusetts, has met its quota of soldiers. Purchased. (5295)

Eggleston, Leroy. 3 leaves and 2 pages.

Letter, 7 September 1944, from Leroy Eggleston (1910-1962) serving aboard the USS Thetis Bay to his mother Doxie Brown (1883-1958) of Botetourt County, Virginia, stating that he is doing his part for victory in World War II. Gift of Beverly Repass Hoch, Wytheville. (53487)

Graybill, Lewis Housman. 4 pages.

Letter, 24 March 1862, from Lewis Graybill (1833-1907) of Patrick County, Virginia, to Mary (Mollie) Wise Taylor (1840-1909) in Fredericksburg, Virginia, stating that he was thankful that she was safely in Fredericksburg after Union troop advances in Prince William County, Virginia. Graybill writes that he believes God will intervene on behalf of the Confederate states against overwhelming odds and mentions the success of the Merrimac (Virginia) against the Union navy. He regrets that they have not married yet and frets over his not enlisting in the army. Purchased. (52870)

Harrison, Matthew. 2 pages.

Letter, 2 February 1864, from M. Harrison (1822-1875) of Loudoun County, Virginia, to an unidentified female correspondent informing her that he is paying money he owes in Confederate banks notes as he cannot pay in federal money. Reverse contains a reply, 15 August 1864, to Harrison noting that the debt holder prefers to be paid in federal money or in groceries, rather than depreciated currency. Purchased. (52754)

Hayes, Susan B. 11 leaves.

Papers, 1990, consisting of two letters between Susan B. Hayes in Metairie, Louisiana, and Margaret Hickerson Emery (1919-2000) in Richmond, Virginia, in which they discuss genealogical topics related to the Davis family of Virginia, the Balfour family of Virginia and North Carolina, an article in National Geographic about the early settlement of Virginia, and Opechancanough. Also includes an extract from Robert Beverley's "The History and Present State of Virginia" and portions of a history of the Davis family of Virginia. Transferred. (52953)

Holt, Saxon W. .45 cubic feet.

Papers, 1890-1940, of Saxon W. Holt (1871-1940) of Newport News, Virginia, concerning his political career as a state senator and as lieutenant governor of Virginia. Papers also include personal correspondence from his father M. Q. Holt (1826-1909) and correspondence from Saxon W. Holt, Jr., (1905-1980) to his sister Maria R. Holt. Papers also include a certificate, 31 March 1890, from Bryant and Stratton College, and the charter and bylaws of the Ragged Island Gunning Association of Virginia. Jones, Walter. 2 leaves.

Letter, 1 August 1840, to Walter Jones (1776-1861) of Washington, D.C., from a committee of Harrison Democrats in Portsmouth, Virginia, inviting Jones to a political convention to be held in Portsmouth and Norfolk, on 10-11 September 1840 in support of Whig presidential candidate William Henry Harrison (1773-1841). Purchased. (52824)

Kitchens, C. M. 2 pages.

Letter, 9 May 1871, from C. M. Kitchens (1832-1913) of Wythe County, Virginia, to J. W. Smith of Washington D.C. regarding the claims of Thomas Pugh (1841-1910) and James W. Yerion (1814-1874), both of Wythe County, to the Southern Claims Commission in Washington. Kitchens encloses the claim certificates (not included) for Pugh and Yerion to Smith, a claims agent. Gift of Beverly Repass Hoch, Wytheville. (53485)

Lee, G. W. 2 pages.

Land tax receipt, 28 May 1890, to G. W. Lee of Prince George County, Virginia, for payment of 1889 assessment. Receipt is signed by W. R. Wood, deputy, for R. T. Daniel, treasurer. Purchased. (52827)

Mailander, Musa. 2 pages.

Postcard, 4 December 1918, to Musa Mailander (1902-1977) of Newport News, Virginia, from her brother Werner in France, wishing her happy holidays. Obverse of the card contains embroidered flags of the allied nations in World War I and "to my dear sister." Werner may have been her stepbrother Frederick Mailander (1898-1950). Gift of Beverly Repass Hoch, Wytheville. (53486)

McCoy, C. D. 2 pages.

Letter, 10 July 1860, from C. D. McCoy (1837-1879) of Charlottesville, Virginia, to his brother Henry P. R. McCoy (1830-1918) of Covington, Alleghany County, Virginia, commenting on his opening a school with Francis W. Henderson in Staunton, Virginia; the address of Daniel W. Voorhees (1827-1897) of Indiana at the University of Virginia; and the crops being grown in the Charlottesville area. Purchased. (52752)

Nelson, Frank. 7 leaves.

Letters, 1914, to Frank Nelson (1851-1922), representing Campbell County in the Virginia House of Delegates, from constituents regarding legislation to create a women's coordinate college at the University of Virginia and regarding a name change for the State Female Normal School in Farmville, Virginia. Gift of Campbell County Historical Society, Rustburg. (52963)

Powell, Benjamin M. 22 leaves.

Papers, 1944-1945, consisting of material related to Benjamin M. Powell's (1905-1964) service as an Air Raid Warden in Covington, Virginia, including identification issued by the Commonwealth of Virginia Office of Civilian Defense and an armband. Also included are ration books for basic mileage and alcohol. Gift of John Travis Pound, Ashland. (52126)

Rahm, Philip. .225 cubic feet.

Papers, 1858-1868, of Philip Rahm (1819-1862) of Richmond, Virginia. Papers include accounts, agreements, promissory notes, and other papers concerning Rahm's business, Eagle Machine Works (also known as Eagle Iron Works). Also includes shares of stock for the Bank of Richmond to Rahm. Papers also include accounts, clippings, correspondence, inventories, receipts, and other papers of A. J. Rahm as executor of Philip Rahm's estate and as guardian of his brothers. Purchased. (53137)

Reid Family. .175 cubic feet.

Account books, 1842-1877, of the Reid family of Prince William County and Alexandria, Virginia. Account book, 1842-1845, of James H. Reid (1804-1869) records payments for items purchased, including livestock and agricultural implements, and services rendered, including the hire of enslaved persons. Account book, 1866-1869, recording Reid's personal finances. Account book, 1866, of Amy Reid (1810-1887) recording household expenses, including purchase of groceries and dry-goods. Scrapbook, 1852, 1877, contains clippings, 1852, of the presidential campaign and clipping, 1877, on Benjamin Butler (1818-1893). Purchased. (53437)

Roller, John E. 1 volume.

Ledger, 1877-1915, of John E. Roller (1844-1918) of Harrisonburg, Virginia, regarding property owned by Roller in Illinois, Missouri, Texas, Washington D.C., and West Virginia, including payment of fees and taxes; property improvements; rental payments; legal action; and other expenses and earnings. Purchased. (53128)

Roop, William T. 1 leaf.

Parole, 29 April 1865, of William T. Roop (1830-1892) of Company G, 64th Virginia Mounted Infantry, promising to return home to Lee County, Virginia, and not to take up arms against the United States government again. Parole approved by command of Colonel William Y. Dillard of the 34th Kentucky Infantry. Purchased. (52960)

Scott, Russell Cecil. 3 leaves and 4 pages.

Funeral Program, 9 February 2018, from the funeral service of Russell Cecil Scott (1925-2018) of Richmond, Virginia. Also includes Scott's obituary from the *Richmond Times-Dispatch*. Gift of Peter Broadbent, Richmond. (52341)

Seddon, John. 4 pages.

Letter, 31 August 1858, from John Seddon (1826-1863) of Fredericksburg, Virginia, to John Letcher (1813-1884) of Lexington, Virginia, asking Letcher to help raise funds to support *The South*, a newspaper edited by Roger A. Pryor (1828-1919), in its editorial battle with the *Richmond Enquirer* which highlighted the political division in the state Democratic party between Letcher and Senator R. M. T. Hunter on one hand and Governor Henry A. Wise on the other. Purchased. (52899)

St. Clair, A. L. (Alfred Lee). 2 pages.

Letter, 29 July 1943, from A.L. St. Clair, possibly in Africa to his mother Mrs. F. B St. Clair in Roanoke, Virginia. The letter, in the form of V-Mail, includes mention of an Arab family, the weather back home, and the upcoming wedding of his brother Harold N. St. Clair (1920-1998). Gift of Donna St. Clair, Forest. (52125)

Smith, Charles W. 4 pages.

Letter, 1 August 1864, from Charles W. Smith (1837-1920) of Company I, 1st Connecticut Heavy Artillery, at Petersburg, Virginia, to Emma A. Leach (1843-1914) of Wolcottville (Torrington), Connecticut, commenting on his regiment's role in the battle of the Crater and negatively describing the performance of the African American troops taking part in the battle. Purchased. (52986)

Smith, John P. 1 leaf.

Tax receipt, 9 October 1856, to John P. Smith of Prince George County, Virginia, for payment of taxes on land, enslaved person, horse, carriage, and livestock. Receipt is signed by Peter Birchett, sheriff. Purchased. (52826)

Synco, Edward P. 20 pages.

Letter, 25 April-29 July 1854, from Edward P. Synco (ca. 1828-1876) of Richmond, Virginia, to Charles H. Tower (1829-1918) of Pittsfield, Massachusetts, providing Tower with three months' worth of news from Richmond, including information on friends, social events, deaths and funerals, and other events. Synco mentions fires in town; the activities of various fire companies; an explosion at the coal pits in Chesterfield County, Virginia; a horse race; and religious revivals. Purchased. (52751)
