What We've Been Doing

- Creating an aggregator for shared discovery of finding aids, which can help with finding related collections across institutions.
- Steadily growing and expanding! We've long since outgrown our original NEH grant from 2000.
- Adding new members, including our first West Virginia member in 2020.
- Developing a process for harvesting finding aids from ArchivesSpace
- Developing EAD training + technology support, including two pathways creating EAD files to upload.
- Offering (limited) support from our volunteer team to help with EAD creation.
- Hosted (and continue to host) information sessions and town halls

- Hopefully, additional support for other finding aid/descriptive record discovery (we want to hear your access challenges and brainstorm creative solutions!)
- Advocacy for a national descriptive record platform (participation in NAFAN and other discussions)
